Directions to Candidates

Follow the directions carefully:

Consider **ALL** the **STARTING POINTS** given below. Then choose **ONE** of them and produce work in response to it.

The use of sharp and fragile glass and other material that can create a health hazard is **NOT PERMISSIBLE**.

Your **FINAL WORK** may be in **TWO** or **THREE DIMENSIONS** unless you are instructed otherwise. The “FINAL WORK” should be clearly marked.

You may discuss your work in progress with your tutor/s but it has to develop in a **PERSONAL** way. Ensure that the work is entirely your own.

You are expected to:

- **INVESTIGATE** visual (primary and secondary) sources and other material.
- **EXPLORE** a range of media to determine an appropriate way of working.
- **KEEP RECORDS** of your work. Your records should systematically show how you reviewed, modified and refined your ideas and work as you progressed.

Your preparatory studies and records must be handed in with your final work. Studies carried out during the course of your work (e.g. notes, sketches, the exploration of different ideas, etc.) are meant to trace your thinking and working process.

If you use photographs, reproductions, illustrations, photocopies, art works, articles, etc., you must show how your work developed in a **PERSONAL WAY**.

You are EXPECTED to demonstrate that you have followed the above process. Failure to do so will make you lose marks.

All two-dimensional work should be submitted in a standard examination folder provided by MATSEC for the price of 1.16 euro. Only **ONE unaltered folder** may be used. You are to ensure that the folder is properly closed before you submit it to MATSEC.

Three-dimensional work should be submitted in an adequate package **not exceeding 50 cm x 50 cm x 50 cm.**

On the folder or package you need to include the words ‘Project Work’, your Index Number and the number of the Starting Point. YOUR NAME MUST NOT APPEAR IN ANY PART OF YOUR WORK.

Choose ONE Starting Point from the list below and develop a work based on your personal response to it.

A still-life interpretation of this section is not an appropriate answer.

The “FINAL WORK” should be clearly marked.

Directions to Candidates

You are to attempt only **ONE** of the two options offered below.

The work may be carried out in any medium or combination of media.

Preparatory studies made during the examination must be submitted with the final work.

You are provided with A2 size paper (420 mm x 594 mm) but you may provide your own alternative A2 size paper. In this case, the supervisor must endorse it before you start your work.

Any quick drying medium can be used but pastels, charcoal and other media liable to smudge must be fixed. Media, fixatives, etc. should be provided by the candidate.

OPTION (a) – STILL-LIFE

Produce Work from Observation of the objects set before you.

Consider your composition carefully, relating the shapes and forms of the objects to their background and to the work as a whole.

OPTION (b) – FIGURE STUDY

Produce Work from Observation of the model posed before you. You are expected to relate the model to his/her setting. The model's rest intervals are not included in the examination time.

You must provide your own model. The model should be dressed in plain, light coloured, casual attire. Spotted or patterned clothing are to be avoided.

The pose and setting are arranged by the supervisor.

3. *The Betrothal of the Arnolfini*, Jan Van Eyck, 1434, National Gallery, London
4. *Las Meninas*, Velazquez, 1656, Prado, Madrid
5. *Christ the King*, Antonio Sciortino, 1918, The Mall, Floriana, Malta
6. *The Scream*, Edvard Munch, 1893, National Gallery, Oslo

Instructions for Supervisor regarding Still-Life and Figure study

The work must be either on an A2 paper provided by the MATSEC Board or candidates may opt to use their own, provided that it is A2 size. If candidates choose to work on their own paper, it must be rubber stamped by the supervisor at the Examination centre prior to the start of the exam. Any quick drying medium can be used but pastels, charcoal and other media liable to smudge must be fixed. Media, fixatives, etc. should be provided by the candidate.

OPTION (a) – STILL-LIFE AND NATURAL FORMS

a magazine

a duster (cloth)

a milk carton

a glass

a packet of tissue paper

a lemon

OPTION (b) – HUMAN FIGURE

The model sits on a chair with his/her left leg crossed over the right thigh. Both hands are joined to support the raised leg at the knee. The head is turned slightly to the right. The model should be observed from a three-quarters view.
